

PLACE-BASED EARLY CHILDHOOD & SPECIAL EDUCATION

Earn your certification through EWU's innovative, affordable, and flexible alternative teacher prep program. All candidates will earn a P-3 ECE Teaching Certificate, with the option of Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) endorsement.

EMPHASIS ON PLACE-BASED LEARNING

Place-based education programs immerse students in the culture and experiences of their home environment. This means classes and field placement take place near your home to complete the program requirements.

Instructional Modalities

You will stay at your current location and join courses via online and inperson instruction led by EWU faculty. This hybrid type of instruction allows for flexibility for work and home, all while meeting teaching and program competencies.

PATHWAYS TO CERTIFICATION

If you have earned an AA degree*, you will turn the AA degree into a bachelor's degree and earn the ECE P-3 teaching certification with the option to add an ECSE endorsement.

If you have earned an BA degree without a teaching certificate, you will earn the ECE P-3 teaching certification with the option to add an ECSE endorsement.

If you have not earned an AA or BA degree you can start with a community college. You can take a seamless pathway from community colleges to EWU to earn a bachelors degree with an ECE P-3 teaching certification with the option to add an ECSE endorsement.

HOW TO APPLY

If you are interested, please contact a School of Education advisor for a transcript and prerequisite evaluation at ewueducation@ewu.edu.

Prerequisites

- GPA above 2.8, at least 101 credit hours completed
- · WEST-B, ACT or SAT score sent to EWU

Must earn a B- or higher in all prerequisite courses *

- EDUC 390 (3cr)
- SPED 363 (4cr)
- ENGL 201 (5cr)
- MATH 208 or 107
- CMST 200 (4cr), CMST 201 (5cr), or CMST 340 (5cr) or approved equivalent
 - * Available at EWU and partner community colleges

If all prerequisites are met, a later enrollment may be allowed and authorized by an EWU School of Education advisor.

Place-based program enrollment starts in **each spring quarter**. Applicants must be accepted by EWU no later than the **September 1st**, and contact ewueducation@ewu.edu to be included in the place-based program application list. In the following fall and winter quarter, applicants will complete the prerequisites.

Pathways 1 and 2 (with earned AA or BA degree)

- Start your journey ASAP with EWU
- Before Jan. 10: notify ewu.edu intent to apply
- During *fall and winter* quarter: complete prerequisites, complete application process
- Start with place-based program in spring.
- · Complete early childhood education core courses in 6 quarters
- Earn your teaching certificate and endorsement(s)

Pathway 3

- Start your journey: apply to EWU articulation program at community colleges
- Complete pathway Part 1 at partner community colleges. Be sure to follow your advisor's guide on the transfer articulation
- Before Jan. 10th: contact ewueducation@ewu.edu for application
- During **winter** quarter: complete prerequisites, complete application process
- Start with place-based program in spring
- Continue the pathway on EWU's end and complete early childhood education core courses in 6 quarters
- Earn your teaching certificate and endorsement(s)
